Thieves targetting allotments!

Allotments across the city have recently been targetted by thieves. Plotholders have had valuable equipment stolen at at least four sites. Although we at Harthill have had vandalism and plant theft problems in the past we have not yet been affected by this latest wave of thefts. There can be no room for complacency, so make sure you take security precautions such as:

- Don't leave valuable gear on site;
- Don't lock any containers on your plot it just makes them a target;
- Scramble the locks;
- Don't give the lock combination to any non-plot holders.

On a related theme, several non-plot holders have been on the site recently and have said they are *watering* a plot in someone's absence. Your plants really don't need much if any watering at this time of year. We're hardly experiencing a drought! So save water and help site security at the same time.

Mersey Forest

Barbara has been taking saplings from Harthill to Mersey Forest, where they are being used in a variety of ways - in a school hedge, an adventure playgound and so on. When we showed City Council cabinet member *Steve Munby* round the site recently he was impressed by this and the general atmosphere and appearance of the site. We have high hopes that Steve will help us to get the sandstone wall repaired before it becomes dangerous.

Silverleaf

There's evidence of *silverleaf infection* on some trees. This mainly, but not solely, affects plums and damsons but everyone need to be alert for it. The leaves have a silvery sheen and the branches will die off. It is highly infectious so if you spot any take remedial action - contact us if you need advice.

Mowing; stones; weed dumping
