So they end up a pain, blocking paths, wasting space. It's best to compost weeds, or burn some of the really tough nuts. And please stop your plants from overhanging the paths, where brambles and raspberry canes in particular try to shred the arms of the mowers. I can tell you, this is VERY annoying. If they aren't cleared, executive action may be necessary.
